Let Your Lights Shine

Matthew 5:14-16 "You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven."

Jesus outlines our role as God's people in these verses. It can be summed up as influence. We will have a significant impact on the world we live in when we follow the principles of God's word. This is the influence of personal character rather than the result of political upheaval or governmental policy. It is the impact that Jesus had in the first century. - Lack of Joy

For all the good that we do as Christians, there will always be darkness, but we must not let that discourage or defeat us. We must remember to put our full trust into God. "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Roman 8:31)

So, is your light shining in this dark world? Can the world see God in us and through us? Our purpose is to be the light of the world, and we need to strive to let our lights shine brighter than what they have in the past.

1 Peter 2:9 "But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light."
