

Bible vs Opinions

Earlier this week, a preacher friend of mine shared this thought: "Not even a million 'I think's' can outweigh a single 'The Bible says.'" This statement highlights the fundamental authority of God's Word over human opinions. No matter how many times a person says, "I think," it can never outweigh the absolute truth of "the Bible says." Human reasoning is limited, subjective, and often influenced by emotions, culture, and personal biases. In contrast, Scripture is divine, unchanging, and the ultimate standard of truth (John 17:17).

1. **God's Word is Absolute Truth:** Human thoughts and opinions can be flawed or contradictory, but God's Word remains steadfast. Proverbs 30:5 says, "Every word of God is pure; He is a shield to those who put their trust in Him." Our thoughts may change over time, but the truth of Scripture does not.
2. **The Bible is the Final Authority:** Many people rely on personal feelings, traditions, or societal norms to determine right from wrong, but God has already revealed His will through His Word. Isaiah 55:8 reminds us, "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways, says the Lord." God's wisdom far exceeds human understanding.
3. **Opinions Do Not Change God's Commands:** Society may evolve, and philosophies may shift, but God's truth remains unchanged. A million differing opinions cannot alter what God has established. Jesus said in Matthew 24:35, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will by no means pass away." If the Bible declares something to be true or sinful, no amount of human reasoning can make it otherwise.
4. **The Danger of Prioritizing "I Think" Over "The Bible Says":** When people elevate their opinions above God's Word, they open the door to deception. In Judges 21:25, the Bible describes a time of moral chaos by saying, "Everyone did what was right in his own eyes." Whenever human reasoning replaces biblical truth, confusion and sin follow.
5. **Faith is Rooted in Scripture, Not Speculation:** Romans 10:17 states, "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Faith is not built on personal speculation but on the firm foundation of God's revelation. When someone says, "I think," it may be uncertain or debatable, but when Scripture speaks, it is final.

When faced with moral or doctrinal questions, always ask, "What does the Bible say?" instead of relying on personal opinions or emotions.

Stand firm in biblical truth, even when the world promotes opposing views.

Seek wisdom from Scripture, knowing that God's Word is the ultimate guide for life (Psalm 119:105).

At the end of the day, a million "I think's" hold no weight against a single "The Bible says."
